2021 Goals

- Work to integrate physical activity as a part of patient treatment
 - Develop physical activity prescription for various categories of people (i.e., older adults, office workers) and adapt these programs for individuals with disabilities
 - Include elective courses about the use of physical activity (with the aim of including it in therapeutic treatment plans) in the program of study in Russian medical universities
 - Implement mandatory physical activity consultation and recommendations for therapists when working with patients
 - Promote clinical recommendations with the aim of prevention and rehabilitation of chronic, non-infectious diseases
 - Develop and expand the number of EIM regional centers within Russia and the regional programs that they offer
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Accomplishments to Date

- Formally established EIM Russia National Center in May 2016
- Prepared clinical recommendations concerning moving activity at the pathology of motor apparatus
- Participated in the formation and functioning of federal school of public health
- Participated in formation of a new model of system of public health (trial project in 2 regions of the Russian Federation)
- Formation of EIM 'departments' in 30 regions of Russia in partnership with the Russian Ministry of Health
- Conducted more than 50 training courses that have reached >6,000 healthcare providers
- Conducted more than 40 training courses that have reached >4,000 exercise professionals

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
