The NHF is funded by both public and private sector through cash and in-kind donations. Activities of the NHF include health educational programs for the promotion of healthy lifestyles and to encourage prevention of heart diseases and stroke in workplaces and a homegrown school feeding program promotes the introduction of school feeding and health program for school children for children 2-7 years of age in public schools in Nigeria.

2023 Goals

- To increase the number of individuals in Nigeria meeting physical activity guidelines
 - To increase the number of healthcare professionals who are assessing, prescribing and counselling patients in physical activity by hosting EIM training workshops
 - To encourage the appropriate deployment of qualified exercise professionals in the prevention and treatment of chronic disease
 - To provide resources on safe physical activity participation to the populace via the EIM Nigeria website, leaflets, flyers, advertorials, newsletters, and magazines
 - To develop EIM-themed physical activity programs to cut across all age groups
 - To expand the EIM On Campus program from the first one (at the University of Ibadan) to other campuses in Southwest Nigeria
 - To develop an EIM Ambassador Programme – a community outreach effort aimed at expanding physical activity into the general community by targeting first class royal fathers as ambassadors
 - To establish a relationship with the Directors of the noncommunicable diseases offices at the federal and state ministries of health

Accomplishments to Date

- Officially established the EIM Nigeria National Center in October 2018
 - Partnered with the Nigeria Heart Foundation and the Nigeria Society of Physiotherapy to organize World Physical Activity Day, which was featured on the local radio (2021)
 - Started an EIM On Campus program at the University of Ibadan (2021)
 - Developed a group call the EIM Nigeria Champions – a multidisciplinary group of younger professionals from diverse backgrounds to provide ideas and planning for EIM Nigeria (2020)
 - Public presentation of the EIM Nigeria (Oct 2019), which received substantial media coverage
 - Established a collaborative relationship with the National Institute of Medical Research, an agency of the Ministry of Health Partnering with individuals from several academic (University of Nigeria, Bayero University, University of Ibadan, University of Lagos) and non-governmental (Nigerian Heart Foundation, Athletic Federation of Nigeria, Nigerian Football Federation) organizations across Nigeria
